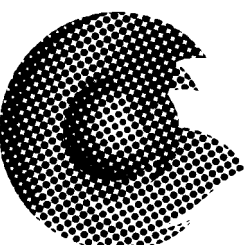

3. SPONSORBLOCK

Speaking of YouTube, many videos have sponsorships that are cut into the video as a deal between the uploader and whoever is paying them. They're jarring and annoying.

SponsorBlock skips those sections! Other users submit timestamps into the extensions database, and they are baked into the video to skip over those cut ins entirely.

Help out your fellow viewers by submitting to the database!

2. UBLOCK ORIGIN

There are many adblockers on the internet, but uBlock is the preferred one. Other adblock extensions don't work on sites like YouTube or other streaming services. From my experience, it works across all internet pages, including Tubi.

uBlock is also available on mobile browsers like Waterfox and Firefox, so you can browse freely even on the go!

Trusted by 10,000,000 users for a very good reason, it hasn't shilled out!
